07 November 2019

Upon arrival at Victoria Falls Airport, you will be met by a member from our andBeyond team and driven to andBeyond Matetsi River Lodge. (Approximately 1 hour). andBeyond Matetsi Private Game Reserve offer a safari oasis that combines an exceptional wildlife experience and 15km (9.3 miles) of private Zambezi River frontage with easy access to the majestic Victoria Falls.

07 November 2019 thru 08 November 2019

Rejuvenate and explore during your 2 night stay at andBeyond Matetsi River Lodge in a Suite with ensuite bathroom. Your stay includes accommodation, three meals daily, soft drinks, house wines, local brand spirits, beers, teas and coffees, refreshments on game drives, scheduled safari activities, sundowner cruise on the Zambezi River, canoeing, fishing and laundry.

09 November 2019

A member from our andBeyond team will collect you at andBeyond Matetsi River Lodge and drive you to Savute Elephant Lodge. Your transfer involves clearing customs and immigration formalities at both the Zimbabwe and Botswana border posts. (Approximately 1 hour). Kasane is a town in Botswana, close to where four countries meet - Botswana, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Kasane serves as the gateway to the famous Chobe National Park and the beautiful Chobe River.

09 November 2019 thru 11 November 2019

Discover the mysterious Savute Channel during your 3-night stay at Belmond Savute Elephant Lodge in a Luxury Tent with ensuite bathroom. Your stay includes all meals, all drinks including a selected list of branded spirits and wines, laundry, two game viewing activities daily and park fees.

12 November 2019

Upon arrival at Kasane Airport you will be greeted by a member from the andBeyond team who will assist you onto a Mack Air light aircraft. From here, you and fellow guests will be flown to Xudum airstrip. Enjoy the beautiful views as you fly over mopane veld which soon reach the breathtaking waterways of the Okavango Delta (Approximately 80 minutes).

12 November 2019 thru 14 November 2019

Put your feet up during your 3 night stay at andBeyond Xaranna Okavango Delta Camp in a Safari Tent with indoor bathtub and al fresco shower, sala and private plunge pool. Before you travel to Southern Africa

INSURANCE	
<p>It is essential adequate travel insurance be taken out prior to departure. This should cover any medical situation such as hospitalisation, as well as cancellation, curtailment of arrangements and baggage. When you travel with andBeyond, you are automatically covered by our emergency evacuation insurance. This guarantees emergency evacuation to the nearest hospital should you suffer either severe illness or injury. This does not cover the cost of treatment once in hospital and in no way replaces your normal travel insurance. There are certain medical exclusions. Please advise us of any existing conditions in advance in order to arrange cover, subject to our insurer's approval. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS	
<p>Please consult your physician before you travel to Africa for advice on precautions against malaria. Anyone who has any special medication should take enough supplies to last the visit.</p> <p>Yellow fever certificates are required for entry into Southern Africa if you have travelled through the yellow fever belt.</p> <p>Ticks can be found in Africa's wilderness areas. To avoid getting bitten when going on bush walks, guests are advised to take precautions by wearing long trousers, socks and boots. Please note that there is a possibility that tick bites could lead to tick bite fever. Symptoms include fever, headaches and painful, enlarged lymph glands in the area of the bite. If you experience these symptoms after returning home, please visit your doctor and advise them of the possibility of tick bite fever.</p>	
PASSPORTS AND VISAS	
<p>Passports are required by all foreign visitors and must be valid for 6 months after the intended length of stay. Please ensure that you have at least 2 consecutive blank visa pages (not endorsement pages) in your passport. Our recommendation is 3 or even 4 blank pages if you are travelling through more than one country. If there are insufficient pages entry could be denied.</p> <p>It is imperative to check your visa requirements with the relevant embassies / consulates as it may vary according to your nationality.</p> <p>Where visas can be obtained at port of entry, these are payable in US dollars cash in most destinations; we recommend small-denominations as officials are not in the position to give change.</p> <p>Visa payments at Livingstone, Lusaka and Ndola Airports' can be made via VISA & MasterCard. Should there be any network issues that affect the systems, guests will be asked to draw the cash at the nearest ATM.</p>	
BOTSWANA & NAMIBIA	Depending on nationality and country of origin, a visa may be required to enter. Visas cannot be obtained at port of entry.
ZIMBABWE & ZAMBIA	Depending on nationality and country of origin, a visa may be required to enter. Visas can be obtained at port of entry and are payable in US dollars cash only.
NEW REGULATIONS FOR FAMILIES TRAVELLING TO BOTSWANA WITH CHILDREN	
<p>Botswana's Ministry of Nationality, Immigration and Gender Affairs has imposed requirements, with immediate effect, for minors (children under 18) travelling through the country's ports of entry. Parents travelling with minors will be required to produce certified copies of their child's unabridged birth certificate, in addition to their valid passports. In the event that one parent is not travelling with the child, the other parent's affidavit, consenting to such travel, will be required. However, an affidavit will not be required if the father's name does not appear on the child's birth certificate. Similarly to South Africa, the new regulations on family travel in Botswana have been implemented as a response to concerns associated with global child trafficking.</p> <p>Both parents travelling with a child:</p> <p>The child's unabridged birth certificate (an original / official birth certificate issued by the birth country, which must include the identification numbers and place of the birth of the child and both parents)</p> <p>Valid passport</p>

CROSSING BORDERS BETWEEN BOTSWANA, ZIMBABWE AND ZAMBIA BY ROAD - WHAT TO EXPECT

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TOURISM DEVELOPMENT LEVY

BOTSWANA	<p>Please note that effective from 1 June 2017, all travelers to Botswana with the exception of residents and citizens of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) member states will have to pay a tourism development levy on arrival (US\$ 30 per person). Although it is advised that payment is possible by means of credit and debit cards at port of entries, it is recommended to carry this in cash.</p>
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FLIGHTS and ACTIVITIES

Check-in is 1½ hours prior for domestic and 3 hours prior for international departures.

Scheduled regional and inter-lodge flights may involve multiple stops before reaching final destination. Flights are operated as "shuttle transfers" and therefore departure times may vary up to 1 hour. Times are subject to change without notice.

In the event of bad weather airlines reserve the right to drop guests off at the nearest serviceable airstrip which may mean a road transfer for guests to get to their final destination. Any costs resulting from such diversions would be for your own account.

Some shuttle inter-lodge flights may depart very early in the morning which means you will miss your morning activity. Regrettably, this is beyond our control as flights are scheduled to meet onward flight transfers and connecting flights out of the various international airports. If a specific departure time is required, a private charter would need to be booked and paid for.

The latest helicopter flight off Benguerra Island is 12h00. If you are scheduled on an earlier flight off the island and connecting onto an International flight from Vilanculos Airport, a short delay at the airport may be experienced.

Aircraft used on inter-lodge flights are small and interior space limited. In addition, some activity and scenic air operators may also have weight and/or height restrictions per guest per seat. For the sake of your own comfort, please advise us at time of booking if you are particularly bulky or tall and we will do our best to accommodate you. Please note additional costs may apply. Please note that in Namibia, our flying partner Scenic Air enforce passenger weight restrictions of 72kg per female and 90kg per male passenger. We will require passenger weight information at the time of booking, and if passenger weights exceed the restrictions (at the time of travel), an extra seat may need to be charged for.

Our flying partner in Botswana, Mack Air would need advance warning for any guests exceeding 110kgs. This information would need to be communicated at time of booking. If Mack Air has not been advised prior to the flight and an additional aircraft needs to be dispatched, this cost will be passed onto the guest.

Please note that in Namibia, our flying partner Scenic Air enforce passenger weight restrictions of 72kg per female and 90kg per male passenger. We will require passenger weight information at the time of booking, and if passenger weights exceed the restrictions (at the time of travel), an extra seat may need to be charged for.

For self-drive guests in Namibia all vehicles on the road have to drive with their headlights on at all times of the day

For self-drive guests it is advisable to arrive at their safari lodge/camp no later than 14h30 as afternoon activities generally starts from 15h00

All meet and greet facilities can be found at the exit doors of the terminal building at Harry Mwangi Nkumbula (Livingstone) International Airport.

International travellers are currently experiencing significant delays at OR Tambo International Airport. This is due to a new, and lengthy, process of capturing biometrics of passport holders. It is unclear as to how long these delays will last. Please ensure that you allow enough connection time when booking guests' flights

LUGGAGE ALLOWANCE

When embarking on an African safari, luggage is required to be packed in a soft bag with no wheels or hard frame. These requirements differ from operator to operator, based on various conditions; however, because most of our guests travel cross border, and with more than one charter airline, we recommend that they adhere to the standard rule. Please do consult with your andBeyond consultant on the exact requirements as per your specific itinerary.

The weight restriction in each region is as follows:

Botswana and Namibia: Maximum of 20kg (44lbs) which includes hand luggage.

Mozambique: Mostly 12kgs (26lbs) with a maximum of 15kgs (33lbs) depending on number of passengers on aircraft. This includes hand luggage.

Zimbabwe: Maximum of 20kg (44lbs) which includes hand luggage.

Zambia: From 15kg (33lbs) with a maximum of 30kgs (66lbs) depending on fare type booked on Profight. This includes hand luggage.

When travelling to any of our destinations in Africa, please remember that it's a criminal offense to be in possession of, to deal with or to traffic in wildlife products. This includes, without limitation, Ivory, Rhino horns, furs, claws, teeth, bones, eggs, meat and feathers of any form of wildlife. The penalties for violating legislation governing the possession and trafficking of wildlife products in Africa are among the most punitive in the world and may even lead to life imprisonment upon successful prosecution. To avoid any inconvenience you are strongly advised not to purchase any wildlife products of any nature from any street vendor, local market place, or village market when participating in any excursion. Only purchase wildlife products which are offered for sale at legitimate curio vendor establishments located within the duty-free demarcated area of the airport as these vendors are required by law to hold the necessary legal permits to enable them to offer for sale the wildlife products on display in their establishments.

CHECK IN TIMES

In accordance with global practice most hotel and lodge check-in/out times are as follows:

- Check-in: 14h00; Check-out: 11h00

WHAT TO PACK

As a general guide, comfortable, casual wash and wear clothes are recommended. Muted colours are recommended for game-viewing. Game-drives are conducted in the early morning and late afternoon which can be very cold, especially in winter.

The most practical items to pack for safari are:

Khaki, green, beige and neutral colours

Shirts with long sleeves (even in summer, as protection from the sun and mosquitoes)

T shirts

Shorts or a light skirt

Jeans or safari trousers for evenings and cooler days

Jackets and sweaters are recommended for early morning and evening game drives

Lightweight water-proof jacket

Swim and beachwear

Comfortable walking shoes

Sunscreen, sunglasses, hat, insect repellent, moisturizer and lip-salve are all essentials

Binoculars and camera equipment

Good quality safari clothing is available in safari shops

Camouflage-patterned clothing is not permitted in Zimbabwe. This applies to any clothing that can be construed as mimicking military-wear. Travellers are urged not to wear, or even carry, any military-inspired clothing while travelling in Zimbabwe.

Laundry: Most lodges, camps and hotels do their best to deliver a same day laundry service, weather permitting. Dry cleaning can be arranged at most hotels but is not available at lodges. At the lodges soap suds are generally provided in your room for delicate items. Please be mindful that, due to culture and customs in many of the areas in which we operate, some lodges/camps do not wash underwear. While most lodges/camps can arrange for your shoes to be polished, we regret that we are unable to provide a service for these to be washed.

FIRST AID

Although most hotels and lodges are equipped with a First Aid kit, we suggest that you bring a small airtight container with a few well-chosen articles, such as: plasters, travel sickness tablets, antiseptic cream, pain relieving tablets for headaches, indigestion tablets, sunscreen, eye drops, insect repellent, medication for upset stomachs and after-sun moisturiser. We remind travellers who have any allergies i.e. insect stings, or an asthma condition, to pack the required medication.

CLIMATE

BOTSWANA	Botswana's climate is mainly temperate. Summer, October to April, can be very hot, but daytime temperatures typically average around 30°C (86°F). The rainy season lasts from January to March. Winter, May to September, brings cooler weather with an average temperature of 25°C (77°F); early mornings and evenings may be very cold.
ZIMBABWE	Although located in the tropics, temperate conditions prevail all year as the climate is moderated by altitude and the inland position of the country. The hot and dry season is from August to October, and the rainy season from November to March. Night-time temperatures can become very cold during the winter months.
ZAMBIA	Although Zambia lies in the tropics, the altitude of the plateau ensures that the climate is seldom unpleasantly hot, except in the valleys. There are three seasons: the cool, dry winter season from May to September; the hot, dry season in October and November; and the warm, wet season from December to April.

Botswana: 220/240 Volts AC, 50hz

Zimbabwe: 220/240 Volts AC, 50hz

Zambia: 220/240 Volts AC, 50hz

It is possible that lodges in more remote areas do not have electricity and run on generator or solar power.

MONEY	
Banks and foreign exchange bureaus are available at all international airports and main towns. Officials may not always be able to issue large amounts of change, so please carry small denominations of cash where possible. Most hotels and lodges accept Visa and MasterCard. Please note that credit card transactions could take anything up to a few months to go through on guests' cards, especially from more remote areas.	
BOTSWANA	General banking hours in Maun and Kasane: Monday - Friday 08.30 - 14.30; Saturday 08.15 - 10.45 The currency is Pula (P); US Dollars cash is widely accepted
ZIMBABWE	General banking hours in main towns are: Monday - Friday 09.00 - 15.00; Saturday 09.00 - 12.00 We recommend small denominations of USD cash. Credit cards are accepted just about everywhere. Foreign nationals are able to withdraw cash from ATM's with a foreign bank card, although it is limited to \$200 per day.

Matetsi Private Game Reserve boasts an exclusive, year-round game viewing experience - both on the water and in the reserve’s spectacular habitats.

The exclusive &Beyond Matetsi River Lodge offers a safari oasis that combines an exceptional wildlife experience with easy access to the majestic Victoria Falls. CHOBENATIONAL PARK

Botswana’s famous Chobe National Park is a must-see wildlife destination that includes the Savute Channel and natural beauty of the Linyanti River. Chobe covers almost 11 000 km² (6 836 square miles), was the country’s first national park and boasts the biggest concentration of wildlife in Africa. But it is best known for its large numbers of Kalahari elephants, probably the biggest continuous elephant population in the world, currently numbering around 120 000.

- Try your hand at catching the fierce tiger fish, or Tilapia in the Okavango Delta.

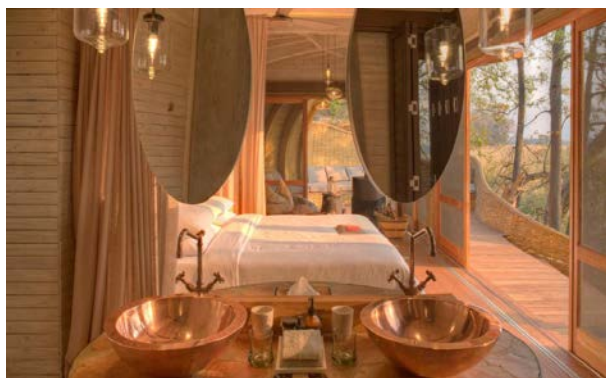
